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## Psalm 78:1-8

Psalm 78:1–8 - *A Maskil of Asaph.*

[1] Give ear, O my people, to my teaching; incline your ears to the words of my mouth!

[2] I will open my mouth in a parable; I will utter dark sayings from of old,

[3] things that we have heard and known, that our fathers have told us.

[4] We will not hide them from their children, but tell to the coming generation the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done.

[5] He established a testimony in Jacob and appointed a law in Israel, which he commanded our fathers to teach to their children,

[6] that the next generation might know them, the children yet unborn, and arise and tell them to their children,

[7] so that they should set their hope in God and not forget the works of God, but keep his commandments;

[8] and that they should not be like their fathers, a stubborn and rebellious generation, a generation whose heart was not steadfast, whose spirit was not faithful to God.

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## Life Group Leader Notes:





•Pastor Cam reminded parents of their responsibility to give the Word of God to their children. How have you seen parents in this group or in the church be obedient to this responsibility? How can we specifically pray for the parents in this group?

•Pastor Cam also reminded the church of her responsibility to help these parents. What are ways the members of this group can come alongside parents to support discipleship in the home? What are ways the members of this group are already doing that? How might your entire group get involved?

•Asaph wants to make sure that parents are teaching their children about the heart of God. If you read through the rest of the Psalm, you will see that God *forgives*, he *provides*, he *guides*. Is it possible for you to share the heart of God with children (or anyone) if you are not regularly experiencing his forgiveness, provision, and guidance?

•How have stories of "the glorious deeds of the LORD, and his might, and the wonders that he has done" shaped your life? What story comes to mind when you consider this passage?

•The text instructs us to *give* the stories to the next generation. We must not simply take them in for ourselves. How are you giving the Bible to other people in your life? Do you regularly share and talk about what you're learning in Scripture? How can you make this a regular habit?

•What does family worship look like in your home? Where did you learn this? How can you grow in this?

•Have you ever thought about the power of storytelling in this way? How can we utilize storytelling this week in our workplace, home, with friends?
