Revelation 14:1-5

Then I looked, and behold, on Mount Zion stood the Lamb, and with him 144,000 who had his name and his Father's name written on their foreheads. And I heard a voice from heaven like the roar of many waters and like the sound of loud thunder. The voice I heard was like the sound of harpists playing on their harps, and they were singing a new song before the throne and before the four living creatures and before the elders. No one could learn that song except the 144,000 who had been redeemed from the earth. It is these who have not defiled themselves with women, for they are virgins. It is these who follow the Lamb wherever he goes. These have been redeemed from mankind as firstfruits for God and the Lamb, and in their mouth no lie was found, for they are blameless.

• "Live Your Truth", "Follow Your Heart", and "You Are Enough" are some popular messages in the world today. Why are these attractive to a dying world? Why do you think these are attractive messages even within the church? What makes them dangerous to believe?

• Can something be good if it is not true? Why or why not?

• Think about the places where you spend most of your time: home, work, church, with friends, etc. How are those places, people, and their truths shaping your life? Are there choices you can make this week to more saturate your life with the Truth?

• Pastor Scott reminded us of the apostles who rejoiced after being arrested, beaten, and threatened in Acts 5. What is the significance of their response? What gave these believers a reason to rejoice? How is this contrary to the popular truths mentioned earlier?

• Believers are described as blameless in this passage and throughout the New Testament. What makes believers blameless in God's sight? What is the significance of this? How does this change the perception you have about yourself? How does it change your perception of other believers?

• Does music affect your heart differently than speech? Think of a favorite song and how it makes you feel. In this passage only the believers know the new song and sing before the throne, the living creatures, and the elders. What do you think that experience will be like?
