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## Revelation 19:11-16

11Then I saw heaven opened, and behold, a white horse! The one sitting on it is called Faithful and True, and in righteousness he judges and makes war. 12His eyes are like a flame of fire, and on his head are many diadems, and he has a name written that no one knows but himself. 13He is clothed in a robe dipped in blood, and the name by which he is called is The Word of God. 14And the armies of heaven, arrayed in fine linen, white and pure, were following him on white horses. 15From his mouth comes a sharp sword with which to strike down the nations, and he will rule them with a rod of iron. He will tread the winepress of the fury of the wrath of God the Almighty. 16On his robe and on his thigh he has a name written, King of kings and Lord of lords. (ESV)

## Life Group Leader Notes:





- As Paul prepared for his final days, he told Timothy that he would soon receive the crown of righteousness (2 Timothy 4:8). But that reward wasn't for Paul alone; it was for *anyone who has loved the appearing of Christ*. Why would this be on Paul's mind in his final days? How often do you long for the appearing of Christ?
- Have you ever sacrificed yourself for something that did not have eternal value in God's kingdom? Has there been a time in your life when you were living like that? When did that change? How did it happen?
- Consider the names of Jesus used in this passage: Faithful and True, the Word of God, King of kings and Lord of lords, and a name written on Him which no one knows except Himself. What do these names have in common? What makes them unique?
- How does it feel to know that you will be present at this event in history? Why is it hard for us to comprehend? Why is it exciting to consider?
- Verse 13 says Jesus' robe is dipped in blood. Whose blood is this? How do we know?
- In conclusion, Pastor Scott encouraged us not to love the enticements of the world but to love Jesus - He must be our greatest affection. How can we love Christ more than our worries, hopes, dreams, and concerns this week?
- The book of Revelation repeatedly calls for the endurance of the saints. We are conditioned to think of the *will* when we think of endurance. We need to grit it out until the end. But according to this sermon, the key to our endurance is our *affections*. Demas loved the things of the world more than Christ's appearing, so he walked away. How is a greater love for Jesus essential to your endurance? One of the main goals of the life group is to grow in your love for Jesus. Perhaps you could take a moment to ask the members of your group if their love for Jesus has grown in the past year. What can you do to continue to strengthen that love?
